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Needlefelt a Robin

These make **eye-catching and timeless** Christmas decorations, or if you make more of them, and would look wonderful strung on bunting or **hung individually on your Christmas tree.**

Moebius Cowl with Anniken Allis



Tuesday 17th September 2024 10am - 4pm

A moebius is a magical thing. It has no right or wrong side and just one edge, and when you knit a cowl in this shape it ends up creating a flowing and elegant accessory.

In this class you will learn the moebius cast-on as well as how to work a basic moebius ring. In the afternoon you can cast on the Criss Cross Moebius Cowl.



Please bring: The Criss Cross Moebius requires: DK yarn (1 x 100g (230m) skein and optional Suri Alpaca/Silk or Mohair/Silk (lace weight, you will need 230m) - you can use just dk yarn if preferred - plus some spare dk yarn for practice, 5mm circular knitting needles, 120cm long & stitch marker.

Skills needed: Confident basic knitting skills (knit, purl, cast on and cast off).

Beginners Crochet with Di Stewart



Wednesday 25th September 2024 10am - 1pm



In this half-day workshop you will learn the basic techniques of working crochet straight:-

- How to hold the hook and yarn.
- How to make the 3 basic stitches; chain, double crochet and treble.
- You will also learn how to crochet backwards and forwards in rows to make a straight piece and learn how to keep it straight!

Information sheets are included with the workshop.

Please bring light coloured DK yarn to practice with. Crochet hooks will be available to borrow at the workshop, but if you have your own hook (4mm), that you would prefer to use, please feel free to bring it along.

Suitable for beginners and returners.

Beginners Sock Workshops with Trish Flemen



Thursday 3rd, 10th and 17th October 2024 2 - 4pm OR Friday 1st, 8th and 15th November 2024 2 - 4pm



Have you always wanted to create your own handknit socks but don't know where to start? Perhaps some gorgeous self-patterning sock yarn has caught your eye and you want to use it, or how about knitting socks as sure-to-becherished presents?

Trish will be running guided sock knitting sessions over 3 weeks, and there will be multiple rounds of the sessions, so if you miss a week you can attend one in a later month. The course costs £45 and includes a ball of yarn and DPNs.

This workshop is ideal for those who are already able to knit but have not yet tackled knitting socks. Knitting in the round would be advantageous but not critical. Trish will be teaching the basic sock pattern by Winwick Mum which is a lovely and versatile beginner's sock pattern.

Crochet Baskets with Di Stewart



Thursday 10th October 2024 10am - 1pm

A half-day workshop to create a gorgeous crochet basket - go big and bold or small and elegant!

You'll learn the basic techniques of working in the round to make a flat circle, working from a pattern. Then you will learn how to create sides from the circle to make a small basket, and will take home a pattern sheet for future use.



Choose between making a small basket with Chunky yarn, or the jumbo basket with Superchunky yarn.

For the small basket, please bring 1 ball each of 2 contrasting colours of chunky yarn. **For the jumbo basket** please bring 200g of Superchunky main colour and 100g of contrasting colour.

Crochet hooks will be available to borrow at the workshop but if you have your own hook (6mm for Chunky yarn, 15mm for Superchunky) that you would prefer to use, please feel free to bring it along.

Suitable for those who have completed the beginner's workshop and also improvers who would like to add to their skills.

Beginners Spinning with Terri Holman



Saturday 19th October 2024 10am - 4pm



Join us for a workshop from expert and enthusiastic local spinner and teacher Terri, who has her own flock of Jacob sheep.

The day will introduce you to the basics of fibre preparation, spinning and plying on a drop spindle and a spinning wheel.

In the morning you will be preparing the fleece for spinning using hand carders and then looking at the basic art of spinning using a drop spindle.

After lunch you will apply this knowledge to the spinning wheel and hopefully produce a skein of plied yarn!

We have spare spinning wheels available but do bring your own working wheel if you have one. Please call beforehand if you are unsure. Fibre and hand carders for spinning will be provided.

Amigurimi Jellyfish with Di Stewart



Wednesday 23rd October 2024 10am - 1pm

Many people would love to crochet cute and cuddly animals, but have difficulty with the techniques and following a pattern.

In this workshop we will be making a simple jellyfish, where you will learn the techniques of shaping that are applicable to all sorts of different animals.

These include: magic ring, working in a circle, how to make a round head by increasing and decreasing in the round, invisible decrease, how to make curly tentacles.



Suitable for anyone with basic crochet skills

Materials: please bring light coloured cotton DK yarn and 3.5mm or 4mm hook. Crochet hooks will be available to borrow at the workshop.

Knit a Beaded Clutch Bag with Anniken Allis



Tuesday 29th October 2024 10am - 4pm







Learn how to knit a beautiful, beaded clutch. The finished clutch can be used as a **handbag or as a project bag**. Learn how to pick up stitches, knit in the round, add beads using the crochet hook method, add lining and assemble the bag.

Stocking Stitch Base (please knit this before the class): Using 4mm needles and DK yarn, CO 45 stitches and knit 10cm in st st, ending with a k row. **DO NOT cast off**. Base should measure 20x10cm. If you base is bigger use smaller needles and vice versa.

Please bring: Stocking stitch base, 4mm circular needles – or size used to knit base (60cm long), 100g dk yarn, 300 size 6 seed beads (in one or more colours – sample used two colours – 150 beads each), 0.75mm crochet hook, two stitch markers (different colours or designs), tubular metal frame (see below – measuring 20x10cm) – **Anniken will have the frames for sale at the workshop for £6 each (please bring cash).**

Skills needed: How to cast on, cast off, knit and purl.

Needlefelt a Gnome

Crochet Squares with Di Stewart

Suitable for: anyone with basic crochet skills.

Please bring: two contrasting colours of DK or aran yarn and 4mm hook (for DK) or 4.5mm hook (for aran). Crochet hooks will be available to borrow at the workshop.

Beginner's Tunisian Crochet with Di Stewart



Thursday 21st November 2024 10am - 1pm



Tunisian Crochet is a form of crochet that uses a long hook to gather up and then work off stitches, making a fabric that is more compact than ordinary crochet, suitable for bags, cushions, hand warmers and many other projects.

Skills you will learn include: the basic techniques and stitches of Tunisian Crochet including purl stitch, how to increase and decrease, and how to use different colours to easily make great effects in your projects.

The workshop will include instruction sheets for the basic stitches and techniques and a pattern for hand warmers which includes all the stitches.

Suitable for: anyone who can make a basic crochet chain-Tunisian crochet is simple and repetitive and easy to pick up!

Please bring: two colours of DK yarn to practice with (not too dark or textured). Hooks will be available to borrow or buy on the day.

Spinning Improvers with Terri Holman



Saturday 23rd November 2024 10am - 4pm

Join us for an improver's workshop from expert and enthusiastic local spinner and teacher Terri, who has her own flock of Jacob sheep.

This workshop is for people who have already participated in Terri's beginner's workshop. This time you will be concentrating on using the spinning wheel.

Applying the basic knowledge learnt from the first workshop, you will be again looking at fibre preparation, spinning and plying on the spinning wheel.

We have spare spinning wheels available but **do bring your own working wheel if you have one**. Please call beforehand if you are unsure.

Mosaic Knitting with Anniken Allis

Mosaic knitting is the easiest way to knit colour work. It looks very effective but only one colour is used per row.

In this workshop Anniken Allis will teach you how to knit mosaic colour work and how to knit from a mosaic chart.

You'll work on a project during the workshop – choose from a pair of hand warmers or an eye-catching scarf.

Please bring:

For hand warmers: two colours of dk yarn – approx 30-50g of each colour, 4.5mm knitting needles, knitting notions.

For scarf: two colours of dk yarn – approx 100-200g of each colour, 4.5mm knitting needles, knitting notions.

Skills needed: Basic knitting skills: knit, purl, cast on and cast off.
